

Main Economic Impacts Related to Port of Trois-Rivières Activities

In 2008, expenditures related to the Port of Trois-Rivières' activities generated \$95.6 million of direct and indirect added value in the Canadian economy (\$128.2 million when induced effects are included). These economic impacts were spread all along the shipping and handling chain. At the same time, the port's transportation and logistics activities have supported more than 1,112 direct and indirect jobs in Canada (1,611 jobs when induced effects are included). The main economic-impact figures are shown in the table below. It should be noted that activities performed and jobs supported by businesses receiving or shipping goods through the Port of Trois-Rivières are not included in these figures.
